SERVICES IN CHURCH

In common with most other churches in the deanery and diocese we have **suspended public worship**. We will review the situation in the middle of February, and decide whether or not it is safe to resume worship, taking full notice of Government, medical and Church of England advice. Regular services will continue online – a 10am livestreamed service on Sunday mornings and a 10am BCP Spiritual Communion on Wednesdays. With the new variant of Coronavirus spreading so rapidly and unpredictably, we could not risk the health of the elderly and vulnerable members of our congregation and ministry team. We sincerely believe, after much prayer and thought, that it is the most responsible action we can take and we are supported by the Area Dean, Archdeacon and Bishops. We look forward to resuming our communal worship as soon as possible. The church will be open for private prayer on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9am–3pm and on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9-11.30am.



THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

In today's Gospel, Mary speaks a truth about our lives, a truth that at some point we all experience: a day comes when the wine gives out. Our glasses will be empty; the party will be over. Life will seem empty and dry—no vibrancy or vitality, nothing growing or fermenting within us. Mary's words hold before us some serious questions and wonderings about where the wine of our life has run out, which relationships have run dry, what hidden parts inside of us remain empty. When the wine runs out, we may be tempted to look for a substitute by working harder, doing more, or just throwing out our glass and jug altogether. Running out of wine is not the failure, the disaster, the shameful calamity, or the tragic end we often believe it to be. Rather, running out of wine is a beginning and paves the way for miracles to happen.
